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HISTORY

In 1846, the Spanish government erected a lighthouse on Puerto Rico at Castillo San Felipe del Morro. It was the first of a series of lighthouses the Spanish government built to improve navigation and aid commerce in the waters surrounding Puerto Rico. In 1869, plans for a larger program of lighthouse construction were approved by the Spanish government and 11 lighthouses were built in and around Puerto Rico during the years 1880-1898. The advent of the Spanish-American War saw the destruction of the lighthouse at Castillo San Felipe del Morro and led to the permanent occupation of Puerto Rico by the United States. Following the conclusion of the war in 1898, the administration of Puerto Rico's lighthouses passed to the United States Lighthouse Board.

The Lighthouse Board oversaw the repair of the lighthouse at Castillo San Felipe del Morro and rebuilt the lighthouse in 1908. In 1910, the Lighthouse Board was dissolved and replaced with the Bureau of Lighthouses, a federal agency operating under the United States Department of Commerce. President William H. Taft appointed George R. Putnam as the 1st Commissioner of Lighthouses, a post he would hold for 25 years. During Putnam's administration, the Bureau of Lighthouses underwent a great period of change as new technologies were adopted to improve the safety and efficiency of lighthouses and navigational aids. From 1921 to 1935, radio beacons, automatic time clocks, photo-electric alarm devices, and battery powered buoys were all introduced to the lighthouse service. These innovations laid the groundwork for the eventual automation of all lighthouse stations.

In 1939, President Franklin Roosevelt approved legislation to transfer the functions of the Bureau of Lighthouse to the United States Coast Guard. Many of Puerto Rico's light stations became obsolete with the advance of new technologies and many have fallen into ruin. By the 1990's and early 2000's, a growing interest in the preservation of lighthouses as historical monuments led to the restoration of several Puerto Rican lighthouses.

	Records include: correspondence, architectural plans, blueprints, mechanical drawings, maps, reports, copies of legislation, property records, memoranda, contracts, invoices, handwritten notes, and photographs.
	The records document the development and administration of light stations in Puerto Rico and the surrounding islands from the late 19th to the mid-20th century. One of the strengths of the collection is the architectural plans detailing the construction of lighthouses which include specifications on their fixtures, lanterns, and attendant outbuildings. Of particular note are the Spanish-era architectural plans, drawn in color on sheets of linen based paper up to 10 feet in length. Also of note, the correspondence from the Bureau of Lighthouses provides a unique insight into the operation of this now defunct federal agency. Additionally, the records contain detailed reports on individual light stations in the 9th Lighthouse District, compiled by the Bureau of Lighthouses.
	The collection has a number of files pertaining to the Port San Juan Light Station at El Morro. There is extensive correspondence (1917-1968) regarding the acquisition of property at the Las Animas Bastion for construction of a lighthouse keeper's dwelling. This correspondence is supplemented with architectural plans for the dwelling as well as a radio beacon tower that was built beside it.
ORGANIZATION	The records are organized into three series: Series I, General Files; Series II, Spanish-Era Records; Series III, Department

	of Commerce, Bureau of Lighthouse Records. The last series is divided into two subseries. [Arrangement]

SERIES DESCRIPTIONS

I. SERIES I: GENERAL FILES, 1903-1991

Arranged alphabetically by subject

This series documents activities of the Bureau of Lighthouses and the U.S. Coast Guard for the Port San Juan Light Station and 9th Lighthouse District. The records include correspondence, copies of legislation, permits, deeds, reports, maps, photographs, cut-out silhouettes, and blueprints.

Principal correspondents include Commanders of the U.S. Coast Guard, Superintendents of Lighthouses, Commissioners of Lighthouses, engineers, and contractors. Many of the records detail the acquisition of land from the Municipality of San Juan in order to construct a lighthouse keeper's dwelling and radio beacon.

II. SERIES II: SPANISH-ERA RECORDS, 1876-1946

Arranged alphabetically by structure name

This series contains architectural plans, mechanical drawings, and blueprints of lighthouses in the Spanish controlled Puerto Rico area. Many of the architectural plans are original works, drawn on linen paper and signed by the engineer. Some records include correspondence and invoices for lighthouse building materials and supplies.

III. SERIES III: DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, BUREAU OF LIGHTHOUSE RECORDS, 1898-1973, undated

This series is divided into two subseries: Subseries A, Correspondence; and Subseries B, Architectural Plans.

This series contains records from the Bureau of Lighthouses, Puerto Rico district.

A. SUBSERIES A: CORRESPONDENCE, 1910-1973

Arranged alphabetically by subject

The records include correspondence, architectural plans, blueprints, newspaper clippings, copies of legislation, property records, memoranda, reports, contracts, invoices, handwritten notes, and photographs. Correspondents include: Superintendents of Lighthouses, Commissioners of Lighthouses, Secretaries of Commerce, Mayors of San Juan, Governors of Puerto Rico, personnel of the Lighthouse Bureau, lamp lighters, and lighthouse keepers. The records include descriptions of lighthouses, land transfers, and

maintenance issues. Also included are records relating to the transfer of the Bureau of Lighthouses to the U.S. Coast Guard in 1939.

B. SUBSERIES B: ARCHITECTURAL PLANS, 1898-1971, undated

Arranged alphabetically by subject

The records include architectural plans, mechanical drawings, blueprints, drawings, and maps. Many of the architectural plans are of the light station, keeper's dwelling, and radio beacon tower at Port San Juan. The mechanical drawings include plans of lighthouse lanterns of several orders of refracting power.
